In Communication, Literacy and Language we will be:

- learning about non-fiction books
- reading stories linked to our homes topic such as 'The Three Little Pigs' and 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'
- learning about signs and labels in our local area
- making a non-fiction book about our hometown
- learning about and making maps
- labelling pictures of buildings.

Our role play area will be a 'Three Little Pigs' construction area where we will be extending our vocabulary.

In Personal, Social and Emotional Development we will be:

- exploring feelings in the context of the children as individuals
- developing self-awareness
- learning about homes within our own cultures and understanding that there are differences
- learn the Building Learning Power word 'questioning'.
- learning about people in our local area who help us.

Global curriculum We will be investigating homes in contrasting locations e.g. India, Spain and China. Key vocabulary Village, town, city, house, flat, detached, semidetached, terraced house, location.

- constructing familiar buildings from different materials
- navigating programmable toys around towns we design
- learning about different types of homes
