Dear Parents.

During this Spring term your child will be studying the following theme: <u>On The Move.</u> Please see our theme plan for an overview of this theme.

The study plan for the core subjects of English and Maths are outlined below.

English

- To check size, proportion and spacing of letters when writing.
- To write in the style of an author or poet who has been studied.
- To compose and rehearse sentences orally to help develop clear and interesting writing.
- To use adverbs and fronted adverbials.
- To create writing which is organised, imaginative and clear.
- To understand the difference between plural and possessive use of the apostrophe.
- To continue to explore descriptive language in all of the children's writing.
- To plan and write their own texts to suit a specific audience.
- To discuss a range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction, reference and text box.
- To add suffixes to words ending in '-f', '-ff', '-ve' and '-fe'.
- To spell more common homophones.
- To read with fluency, understanding and expression.
- To summarise a text using key points and ask questions about a text which develop understanding.
- To read for a range of purposes.
- To use a dictionary to check words and their spellings.

Maths

- To use different mental strategies to help with multiplication and division.
- To develop understanding of place value in four digit numbers and use this to: order four digit numbers, round to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and count on and back by 10, 100 or 1000 from any four digit number.
- To use different mental strategies to help with compact written subtraction.
- To recognise acute, obtuse and right angles.
- To revise measurement, particularly time and the 24 hour clock.
- To investigate and sort 2D shapes according to their properties.
- To add and subtract money using various strategies.
- To calculate perimeter and area of some 2D shapes
- · To find equivalent fractions.
- To divide 2 or 3 digit numbers by a single digit.
- To calculate change from £10, £20 and £50,
- To recognise, use, order and compare decimal numbers.

To help your child with their study, please:

- Encourage your child to read each evening.
- Help your child to learn their times tables off by heart.
- Ensure your child completes their homework each week.
