## Year 5 Class Corner

Over the past weeks, Year 5 have been working hard across all areas of the curriculum. In Maths, we have been developing our confidence with multiplication and division, using a range of strategies to solve problems. We have also started to explore fractions, so far learning how to recognise equivalent fractions and how to convert them into mixed numbers.

In English, we have begun studying The Saga of Erik the Viking. The children have started to learn how to write effective letters, using the features of formal correspondence to write a letter back home. We have also been planning our own episodic stories, using the text as inspiration for creating exciting characters, settings and adventures.

In Science, we have started to investigate changing oceans. We have started to look closely at the threats and dangers facing marine environments, including pollution, climate change and the impact of human activity. The children have been developing their understanding of how these changes affect ocean life and why it is important to protect these habitats.

In PE, we have begun learning the rules and skills needed for benchball and hockey. The children have been practising teamwork, coordination and tactical thinking as they learn how to move, pass and defend effectively in both sports.

In Computing, we are learning all about systems. This has included exploring how different digital and real-world systems work, how information is stored and transferred, and why systems need to be reliable and efficient.

In History, we are continuing our study of the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. We have been digging deeper into their justice systems, comparing how each group dealt with crimes and disputes. We have also started to investigate how their reigns in Britain eventually came to an end, and the key events that shaped this period of history.

Start with → Class Teacher

They know your child best and will be able to resolve most issues.

If unresolved → Behaviour Lead: Miss Sansom

If still unresolved → Deputy Headteacher: Mrs Derriman

Next → Headteacher: Mrs Sophia Ovonlen

#### 2. Pastoral / Emotional / Friendship Concerns

(Playground issues, friendships, wellbeing, possible bullying including discriminatory behaviour)

Start with → Class Teacher

If unresolved → Behaviour Lead: Miss Sansom

If still unresolved → Deputy Headteacher: Mrs Derriman

Next → Headteacher: Mrs Sophia Ovonlen

#### 3. SEND Concerns

(Suspected or known SEND, learning needs, behaviour linked to SEND, access arrangements, reasonable adjustments)

Start with → Class Teacher

Then, SENCo – Mrs Derriman

Then → Headteacher: Mrs Sophia Ovonlen

#### 4. Safeguarding Concerns

(Immediate safety, disclosures, neglect, abuse, welfare concerns)

Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL): Mrs Sophia Ovonlen

**Deputy DSLs:** Mrs Deriman, Miss Sansom, Mr Downey, Mrs De Howes, Mrs Hutchinson

For urgent concerns: Contact via the school office immediately.
