## School Dinner Survey

Thank you for completing our recent school dinner survey. We had 151 responses and will be looking at your comments closely in preparation for our winter menu in October. In the meantime we will be continuing with our fortnightly pre-booking system which 61.58% of you preferred. We will be increasing the price of our meals to £2.20 per day from September 2021 and will be returning to a choice of two options being available, along with our salad bar re-opening.

We have issued our menu for the first two weeks of returning to school and we would be grateful to receive your pre-orders by 10:00 am on Monday 19 July 2021 to allow us time to order with our suppliers. You will be able to revisit your orders through the Parentmail app by viewing the form submitted, alternatively you could take a screen shot. We will be unable to accommodate any late orders.

## Friends Meeting

It was lovely seeing you at our recent zoom Friends meetings that have taken place this week which discussed plans for the future. We are hoping to re-establish a Committee at an AGM to be held in September which will coincide with our regular MacMillan Coffee Morning event—more details will be provided at the beginning of the term. The Friends have £5000 in their account through recent fundraising events and we have issued a survey to ask parents how they wish this money to be spent. We look forward to being able to return to a schedule of events run throughout the year, but this is only possible if we can get parents on board. # <u>Parking</u>

We are still receiving a number of complaints from local residents about the inconsiderate parking of some of our parents. It is a criminal offence to park on pavements, which then force the public and children to walk in the road which may cause a serious accident. Please could we therefore remind you to:

- Not to park on the pavements
- Not to block driveways/garages and access roads—residents also have children to collect from school and appointments to attend
- Not be park on green areas
- Not to park on the corner of junctions so to allow the flow of traffic and a clear view of oncoming traffic
- Allow access for emergency vehicles

A limited number of parking permits are still available from the school as part of the 3PR parking scheme organised through North Essex Parking Partnership. These will allow for free parking in the Wayre car park behind the High Street whilst dropping off and collecting the children from school. Alternatively, the disused area of garages in Chippingfield could be used.

Children should arrive at school between 8:40-8:50 am and go straight into classes. We will continue to use the front of school gates on London Road for Y3-6 children.
