**Start with → Class Teacher**

They know your child best and will be able to resolve most issues.

If unresolved → Behaviour Lead: Miss Sansom

If still unresolved → Deputy Headteacher: Mrs Derriman

Next → Headteacher: Mrs Sophia Ovonlen

### **2. Pastoral / Emotional / Friendship Concerns**

*(Playground issues, friendships, wellbeing, possible bullying including discriminatory behaviour)*

**Start with → Class Teacher**

If unresolved → Behaviour Lead: Miss Sansom

If still unresolved → Deputy Headteacher: Mrs Derriman

Next → Headteacher: Mrs Sophia Ovonlen

### 3. SEND Concerns

*(Suspected or known SEND, learning needs, behaviour linked to SEND, access arrangements, reasonable adjustments)*

Start with → Class Teacher

Then, SENCo – Mrs Derriman

Then → Headteacher: Mrs Sophia Ovonlen

### 4. Safeguarding Concerns

*(Immediate safety, disclosures, neglect, abuse, welfare concerns)*

Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL): Mrs Sophia Ovonlen

Deputy DSLs: Mrs Deriman, Miss Sansom, Mr Downey, Mrs De Howes,  
Mrs Hutchinson

For urgent concerns: Contact via the school office immediately.
