Huge additional costs due to COVID, as well as an increased number of children needing additional adult support in school, means that our budget is tighter than it has ever been before. However, we are determined to continue to provide our children with a full and enriched curriculum, as well as making this year a year to remember. To provide for all this, we have decided to carry out a non-uniform day at the end of every half term. As we do not want to be asking too much of you (we know money is tight with many of you as well) we have made the hard decision not to support national charities, as we usually do, we feel that this year it is our own children that are in need. However, you are always able to support these charities in your own way, outside of school.
