Year 2 Class Corner

Year 2 have been super busy since the last time you heard from us!

In English, we have been story tellers and have been retelling the story of the tunnel. We used freeze frames to act out key parts of the story to help us remember it. In maths, we have been focusing on fractions. We have learnt what unit and non-unit fractions are and have become experts at finding one third, one half and one quarter of things.

Our DT project is all things sewing. We are going to be making a pouch/purse for us to keep our special items in. We have looked at some existing pouches and found what we like and don't like about each one. This has inspired us and helped us create our own drawings and ideas.


In Geography, we have been putting our memory to the test and recapping our knowledge about Antarctica. We understand why Antarctica is so cold and why no one lives in Antarctica. We made links between the clothing people wear, animals and places.

During PE, we are developing our skills of Cricket. So far, we have practiced our over arm and under arm bowling. We developed our accuracy of bowling by trying to bowl a tennis ball into a hula hoop. Our next step is to think about batting skills. We will learn the technique of batting as well as how to hold the bat correctly.

We are becoming super spellers. Over the past few weeks, we have been focusing on adding suffixes to root words to change the meaning of the word. We have learnt the suffixes -ful, -ly,, -ment,, -est, -ing. There are certain rules with these, and we have become confident in identifying which rule is for each suffix.

In RE we are focusing on the Jewish faith and learning more about their celebration of Passover. First, we asked lots of questions that we aim to be able to answer at the end of the term. We now know the story of how Passover came about. It all began with a man called Moses in Egypt. The children were very curious as to why Now we know how Passover came about we are going to learn how Jewish people celebrate it and the key artefacts that they may use each year.

Year 2 have been exceptional learners yet again. We know that they will remain working hard and will continue learning new things ready for Year 3!
