Class Corner: Year 2!

Year 2 have had a fantastic start to the year. They have been learning nonstop (both in school and at home) and are always sharing their thoughts and opinions in every single lesson. During maths we have explored greater than, less than and equal to: We used rulers and multilink to prove that each number is either greater than, less than or equal to. We are more confident with using this vocabulary and know that we can prove our answers using these words.

We are becoming expert writers this term. We have been working hard to make sure our writing includes capital letters and full stops. Using the book Mrs Armitage on wheels, we were able to use adjectives and conjunctions to write a description about her. Miss Sansom doesn't like the words 'big' or 'small' so we have developed our adjectives to find stronger, more powerful words to replace these. Over the next few weeks, we are going to be writing a report about the Titanic making sure we have included all the special features.


Our history topic has enabled us to think carefully about the past, questioning our ability to use olden day vehicles. We have recently looked at the development of boats with a focus on The Titanic. Using our chronology skills, we put the titanic events in order and have gained a better understanding of the events that took place during the time of the sinking of The Titanic. We were all very interested and came up with some good questions to further our thinking.

Our most recent wellbeing lesson gave us an opportunity to understand how people may feel when being bullied. We used a conscience alley to share our ideas of how people may feel. This is where one person walks down the middle of two lines, while doing this we all said a word related to how someone may feel if they were being bullied. We shared words like unwanted, scared, lonely, mad, disappointed and worried.

During Art we have been developing our drawing skills. We have recently looked at ways that we can create patterns and textures. We also used special drawing pencils to show tones. These pencils either have a light tone or a dark tone. We learnt that you can make a light and dark tone using one pencil by increasing the pressure when drawing.

The class has truly been superstars this half-term, engaging deeply in every subject. With so many activities connecting across the curriculum, it's been a vibrant, hands-on learning experience. We are proud of the effort and enthusiasm Year 2 have put into the learning this term. We are looking forward to even more learning this term.

<u>Asda Rewards Cashpot for Schools</u>


