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Safeguarding Update Helping Children Spot Fake News

These days, our children see so much online—videos, posts, news stories—that it can be hard for them to know what's real and what isn't. Fake news and conspiracy theories can look very convincing, and young people can easily come across them while scrolling or gaming.

The best way to keep them safe is through simple conversations at home. You might:

- · Ask what they've seen online and listen without judgement.
- Show them how to check if a story comes from a trusted source.
- Remind them that just because something is shared widely doesn't mean it's true.
- · Reassure them that it's okay to ask questions if they're unsure.

A handy phrase children can remember is: "Pause and check."

Together, we can help children grow up confident in spotting what's fact and what's fiction online.
