Break-time snacks

Please be reminded that break time snacks should only be pieces of fruit or vegetable sent in for Key Stage Two children. Children are not to eat items from their lunch boxes such as bread sticks, cheese dips etc.

Children in Key Stage One are provided with free fruit from the government scheme so there is no need to provide anything further for these classes.

School Grid dinner orders

Please ensure that you have ordered your child's dinner or are providing sandwiches each week. You can order or make changes up until 8:55 am each morning or even book a full week, half-term.

If the system shows no pre-order at service time, you will be called to provide sandwiches for your child if able. If our catering team are required to provide a lunch this will be the cold option that is available.

Tesco Stronger Starts

Mild Illnesses & Attendance

There is wide agreement among health professionals and educational professionals that school attendance is vital to the life chances of children and young people. Being in school improves health, wellbeing and socialisation throughout the life course. The greatest benefits come from children and young people attending school regularly.

It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. We are sharing the NHS 'Is my child too ill for school?' guidance with parents and carers which has further information available on our website <u>here</u> and scroll to the sickness tab.

Please ensure you report absences to the school office every day with details of illness. An "unwell " will be followed up by a telephone call requesting more information.

Applying for Secondary Schools

As you may be aware, the new secondary school admission round opened on Tuesday, 12 September 2023, for parents of current Year 6 children to apply for a secondary school (Year 7) place for September 2024. The statutory national closing date for applications is 31 October 2023.

Applications can be made online via <u>www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</u>. 99% of parents in Essex applied online last year. The website also has a copy of the Secondary Education in Essex 2024-25 booklet which contains details of all secondary school admission policies.
