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		Absence Procedures Please call the office if your child is sick following usual attendance procedures. If your child/ren has Coronavirus or are showing symptoms of Coronavirus (however mild) or are in quarantine. They must also not attend school if a member of their household has Coronavirus or is showing symptoms of Coronavirus. Check for a temperature of 38 degrees or above. Call NHS direct for advice. The pupil will be marked with an X in the register. Remote learning arrangements For an individual self-isolating at Tier 1: The child/ren will be encouraged to use Oak Academy if they are well enough to work, on day one. Within 24 hours the teacher will make contact via email and will upload the previous days learning onto Seesaw, Tapestry or by email. Learning will be the same as that which the class is receiving but will be a day behind. A member of staff will endeavor to make contact with the child every day to support learning and provide feedback whilst your child is away from school and allow them to continue with the class learning and topics.
