

## The use of the Sport Premium in 2019/20

Amount of Sports Premium awarded to Fawbert and Barnard's Primary School - £17800

Actual Spend – **£12,294**

HSSP Membership (Harlow School Sports Partnership)	£1000	All pupils from Years 2-6 have the opportunity to compete in a variety of competitions.	We attended 9 events for our £1000 as well as having CPD and updates. This year a lot of the different events in Spring and Summer were cancelled due to the Coronavirus pandemic. As most of the events for bat sports occur during the summer term this was a shame – however there were a lot of pieces of advice from our SGO. One member of staff for our school was promoted to chairperson of the association for this year which was good to raise the standing of our school this year around the town. We attended a SEN event where children with SEN attended. Through attending events we ensured that Pupil Premium children attended through whole class events in Year 3 and 4 and targeted involvement in Year 5 and Year 6.
Qualified PE teacher	£4472	Our qualified PE teacher is used to train the teachers in effective teaching of PE. She teaches each class for two terms of the year. Further to this she also leads one extra-curricular activity. RE teaches for 6 hours per week and 1.0 hours of extra-curricular work per week.	Our PE teacher observed 3 teachers in KS2 and gave feedback on how to improve teaching of PE. She also took part in curriculum development and prepared planning and lessons for all year groups to teach even when she is not in school. All of our sporting events this year were run by our PE teacher and she organised and facilitated our two Change4Life clubs in both half terms of Autumn term. An additional Gymnastics club was fully subscribed this year and more clubs are planned for next year. Two of our teachers were coached this year for at least half a term each, observing the specialist teach their class one lesson of Gymnastics as this was a curriculum area that they were lacking confidence in. They would observe on a Monday and then re-create this lesson or activity in the future. The children learned skills initially from a specialist and then responded

			positively to their own teacher. Next year a new teacher will be coached to increase the number of practitioners teaching to a Good standard. We will retain the services of our specialist teacher for next year.
Walking bus 4.5 hours a week	£1800	This walking bus should help the school keep children healthy and enthusiastic about exercise.	The walking bus for this year was well represented and parking around the school has eased. Through school surveys parents and children both agreed that the walking bus has encouraged the children to walk to school instead of driving to school. Through parent survey results we set up and established a second route to school so that more children were able to benefit from this scheme. We will continue this action next year.
Chessboard and Copy Me playground markings	£1350	The playground needed to be re-painted in a way that will keep the children thinking both actively and tactically hence the Copy Me painting which will encourage the children to move and improve muscle memory by copying a friend. The chessboard increases tactical thought which will improve invasion games.	The playground markings have refreshed the playground and the children are encouraged to be more active during break times. The chess board encourages tactical thinking and has led to a good uptake in the extra curricular Chess club. Children have used the Copy Me playground marking daily at both break times and lunch times and will continue to be used in the future. Perhaps we could include some new markings on the Meadow playground.
Contribution to coach travel for swimming	£400	For our children to arrive at swimming we need to reserve a coach. The sports premium will help the school afford travel. All children will need to learn to swim by the end of KS2.	This money has impacted 3 class outcomes, allowing children in KS2 to attend swimming lessons - which they would not be able to undertake without transport as there are not swimming pools close enough to our school. This year the percentage of the Y6 class who can swim 25m+ independently rose from 63% to 80%.
Escort to Table Tennis	£450	To allow our children to attend the local BATTs table tennis club the children need to be escorted by an LSA to and from the club as well as supervision within the club times.	We introduced the new Table Tennis club this year to get the children interested in a new sport. It was also a new extra-curricular club where the school attempted to build on the success we had last year where we won the Harlow Table Tennis tournament for KS2. We will have to purchase new table tennis equipment to continue the growth we made.
Colour PE Benches x 4	£2000	Throughout the wear and tear of the school equipment for the year some of our benches were condemned as unuseable in PE lessons- we will be replacing these benches for the school's house colours.	These benches arrived and are used daily in lessons, they are a good resource for dividing teams and queuing during PE lessons, especially useful for dodgeball where the team waiting to return to the field have to sit on benches. These benches are also used in assemblies for Year 6 daily and sit in their corresponding house colours on that bench.
New PE kit for tournaments and	£822	Additional money spent on the new PE kit to wear to sports events. This will mean that all	New kit means that the children will feel more comfortable playing as a team as well as being given as a reward the children who have worked
