Our Expectations!




In Year 1 we expect the best from your children at all times!

- > The best behaviour.
- > The best efforts to produce the best work.
- > The best appearance. (No earrings please)
- > Children must wear the school uniform.
- Children will do their very best to improve each piece of work to ensure that they make excellent progress!

Reading

- > It is expected that pupils read at home from a very early age.
- In Year 1 it is essential that they read for a good 5-10 minutes at least three times per week.
- Read each book twice once for fluency and then for expression.
- We have a flexible book change approach no fixed day to change books. They choose their own book from the suitable reading stage. Children are responsible for placing their books in the changing basket.
- NO READING RECORDS! We do not give out reading records in KS1, but we keep a note of what your child has read.
- ➤ OUR NEW READING SCHEME We will introduce the children to a new reading scheme which means that the children will read everyday. Their reading will be closely monitored by the adults. This was trialled in Year 1 last year and was a great success!


English

Homework

Homework is an essential part of your child's learning. It supports the work that they do in school and ensures rapid progress. Children should be able to complete their homework independently.

Weekly Homework Weekly homework using Numbots and daily reading must be done. This weekly homework is very important, and we are now making this compulsory.

Homework will be given out at the start of a topic and there will be a due in date given. It is not compulsory but will support the children with their learning this term.


Attendance
